EDWARD C. KEENAN

Edward C. Keenan was born in West Philadelphia on September 11, 1946, and is one of eight children. He has been married for fifty-three years to Paulette Pendze. They have been blessed with three children, Jennifer, Joanne and Paulette. Jennifer is married to Stephen Keil and they have three sons, Stephen Edward (32), Austin (23) and Ryan (18).
